2. More than one ITEM per class will be accepted except Photography. Horticulture varieties should be named.
3. Volunteers will be available to assist exhibitors to present their exhibits.
4. The decision of the judges is final.
5. The group will not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits. However, the group will exercise the greatest care possible.
6. Display area MUST be free of exhibitors before judging starts.
7. Late entries will be accepted for display only
8. Exhibits SHOULD ONLY BE COLLECTED after the end of the SHOW. If exhibits are removed prior to that time, prizes and awards will be forfeited.
9. The Executive reserves the right to decide on any point not covered by the rules and regulations
10. Awards and Prize Money will be presented on Sunday, August 18 at the end of the show at 5:00pm when picking up exhibits

HORTICULTURAL

Rules & Tips

- 12. All Exhibits must be free of Insects and Disease; have been in the Exhibitors possession for at least 3 months. **The plant variety name on the tag is very much appreciated by spectators.**
- 13. Flowers - Quality is as important as size of individual blooms.
- 14. Classes that call for **one stem or spike** can be shown with buds, leaves, and flowers.
- 15. Marigolds, petunias, etc. - the flower only is judged. It is recommended that they be exhibited on a foil covered plate with holes for the flower stems. Please include water.
- 16. Dahlias are shown with the first set of leaves attached.
- 17. Gladioli are shown with stems as long as possible with leaves attached, supported or in a narrow neck container.
- 18. Lilies show have as long a stem as possible with some leaves attached.
- 19. Exhibitors must provide their own containers for fruit, vegetables, and cut flowers. Only in the **arrangements** will containers be judged.
- 20. Bouquet is a collection of flowers in a container or vase, **not arranged.**
- 21. Other:
 - A.) Fruits, Berries, Candles, Driftwood, etc. are allowed only in classes 144, 145, 146, 147, 150, 157, 158.
 - B.) All Vegetables and Fruit samples should be of **moderate uniform size, shape and colour.**
 - C.) Check for the correct number of Flowers, Vegetables and Fruits.
 - D.) All vegetable samples should be clean (but not scrubbed) and free of blemish or damage.
